Read all these instructions, and follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.

- Place the product on a flat, stable surface that extends beyond the base of the product in all directions. If you place the product by the wall, leave more than 10 cm between the back of the product and the wall. The product will not operate properly if it is tilted at an angle.
- Avoid places subject to dust, shocks, or vibrations.
- Place the product close enough to the computer for the interface cable to reach it easily. Do not place or store the product or the AC adapter outdoors, near excessive dirt or dust, water, heat sources, or in locations subject to shocks, vibrations, high temperature or humidity, direct sunlight, strong light sources, or rapid changes in temperature or humidity.
- Do not use with wet hands.
- Place the product near an electrical outlet where the adapter can be easily unplugged.
- The AC adapter cord should be placed to avoid abrasions, cuts, fraying, crimping, and kinking. Do not place objects on top of the cord and do not allow the AC adapter or the cord to be stepped on or run over. Be particularly careful to keep the cord straight at the end.
- Use only the AC adapter that comes with your product. Using any other adapter could cause fire, electrical shock, or injury.
- The AC adapter is designed for use with the product with which it was included. Do not attempt to use it with other electronic devices unless specified.





⏹ Stop Button	Cancels scanning.
⏪ Start Button	Starts scanning.

Page Separation Lever

Change the position of the page separation lever depending on the type of document you are going to scan.



	<p>Separation feeding</p>	<p>You should normally use separation feeding. Documents with multiple pages are fed one sheet at a time.</p> <p>➔ "Loading Documents" on page 14</p> <p>Use this mode when scanning standard plastic cards. You cannot scan embossed cards.</p> <p>➔ "Loading Cards" on page 19</p>

Placing Originals on the Product

You cannot load the following documents:

- Thermal paper
- Coated paper
- Document with an uneven surface
- Photos
- Document with wet ink
- Ripped, wrinkled, or curled documents
- Document with staples or paper clips (which may damage the paper source)
- Documents with holes (not including punched holes)
- Bound documents
- Documents with carbon paper on the back
- Non-paper document (such as clear files)
- Transparent documents
- Glossy documents
- Carbon-less paper
- Perforated documents
- Document with labels or stickers



Important:

Do not feed photos or valuable original artwork into the scanner directly. Misfeeding may wrinkle or damage the original. When scanning such originals, make sure you use the carrier sheet (sold separately).


Loading a mixture of documents at different sizes

You can load a mixture of documents at different sizes. When loading documents, follow the notes below.

- You can load a mixture of documents from A6 to A4/letter size.
- Load the documents in the input tray in descending order of paper size with the largest at the back and the smallest at the front.

Placing Originals on the Product

- ❑ Load the documents at the center of the input tray with the edges of the documents aligned.




- ❑ Slide the edge guides to fit the edges of the widest document.

Loading documents

Follow the steps below to load the document.

- 1 Extend the input tray, slide out and extend the output tray, and then raise the stopper.




- ❑ When scanning documents that are A6 size or larger, extend the input tray all the way.
- ❑ When scanning documents larger than A4 size, do not raise the stopper.
- ❑ Extend the output tray and use the stopper to match the size of the document you are scanning.

- 2 Slide the edge guides on the input tray all the way out.




- 3 Make sure that the page separation lever is lowered.




Placing Originals on the Product

- 4** Load only the first page of your documents into the input tray with the printed side facing down and the top edge facing into the feeder. Slide the paper into the feeder until it meets resistance.



Note:


- Load business cards horizontally.
- Align the edges of the documents; otherwise a paper jam may occur.



- Smooth out the folding lines on the documents before loading them.

Scan results are not guaranteed for plastic cards with shiny surfaces.

You can load plastic cards with the following specifications into the product.









- 4** Load the card into the input tray with the printed side facing down and the top edge facing into the feeder. Slide the card into the feeder until it meets resistance. Then slide the edge guides to fit the edge of the card.

! **Important:**

- ❑ Do not load plastic cards vertically.

Raise the page separation lever to scan paper that has been folded in half, envelopes, or non-standard size documents.




When loading a photo or paper that is an irregular shape, use the carrier sheet (sold separately). You cannot use a clear file instead of the carrier sheet.

See the following for more information on placing the document in the carrier sheet.

- If the document is smaller than A4 size, insert it into the center of the carrier sheet with the side to be scanned facing down.



- If the document is larger than A4 size, fold it in half so that the side to be scanned is facing out, with the right side at the front.

3 Click  (**Scan**) icon.


4 Set all of the items, and then click **Scan**.

If you want to make detailed settings such as image quality, click **Detailed Settings** to display the “Epson Scan” scanner driver screen, and then make the necessary settings.

The scanned document is displayed in Document Capture Pro.

5 Check the scanned images (pages), and then edit as necessary.

6 When you have finished checking the image, click the destination icon.



7 Make settings for each item, and then click **OK** or **Send**.

Note:
 On the Batch Save window or the Transfer Settings window, click **File Name Settings** and then select **Apply job separation** to sort the documents into separate files by detecting blank pages or barcodes in your scanned images.

The scanned image is saved to the folder you specified.

The Preview window displays the scanned image.



Important:

The first page is ejected and the scanned image is displayed in the preview window. Reload the ejected page, and then scan again.

- 5 Click **Image Adjustment** tab, and then make adjustments to the image quality such as the brightness.

Note:

When Auto Detect is selected as the Size setting, depending on the value of the Brightness or the Contrast, the scanning area may not be detected correctly.

In this case, select a size of the scanning area other than Auto Detect as the Size setting.

- 6 Click **Scan**.

- 7 In the File Save Settings window, make settings for each item and click **OK**.

Note:

*If the **Show this dialog box before next scan** check box is cleared, Epson Scan starts scanning immediately without displaying the File Save Settings window.*

The scanned image is saved to the folder you specified.


Scanning to SharePoint or Cloud Service

You can upload scanned images to a SharePoint Server or Cloud Service.

Note:

You need to create a cloud service account before using this function.

- 1 Start Document Capture Pro and scan your document.

- 2 On the Main window of Document Capture Pro, click the destination icon.
 - See the Help for details on Document Capture Pro.



- 3 On the settings window, make settings for each item and then click **Send**.

The image is uploaded to the target server.

Scanning Multiple Documents to Separate Files

This function sorts documents into separate files by using a variety of detection methods such as blank pages or barcodes inserted between the scanned images.

Various Types of Scanning

Note:

The actual operations may differ depending on the destination selected.

- 1 Load a document into the input tray including indicators, such as blank pages, between the pages where you want to separate the data.
- 2 Start Document Capture Pro and scan your document.

- 3 Click **File Name Settings** on the Batch Save window or the Transfer Settings window.
- 4 Select **Apply job separation**, and then click **Separation Settings**.
- 5 Select the separation method and the method for specifying the folder name on the Job Separation Settings window, and then click **OK**.

- 6 Make other settings on the File Name Settings window, and then click **OK**.
- 7 Make other settings on the Batch Save window or the Transfer Settings window, and then click **OK** or **Send**.

Scanned images are saved separately based on the separation method selected.

Assigning a Specified Scanning Setting to a Program

By registering a specific scanning operation to a scanner button, you can perform that operation by simply pressing the scanner button. The operation number is displayed on the scanner and you can select the operation you want to start.

You can also register settings, such as separator processing, save format, and save as/destination.

Epson Scan offers a variety of settings for improving color, sharpness, and other aspects affecting image quality.

<p>Unsharp Mask</p>	<p>Sharpens the edges of image areas.</p> 
<p>Descreening</p>	<p>A ripple or cross-hatch pattern (known as moiré) may appear in a scanned image of a printed document.</p>

<p>Text Enhancement</p>	<p>Enhances text recognition when scanning text documents.</p> 
<p>Auto Area Segmentation</p>	<p>Scans text in Black&White and applies grayscale to any images in the document.</p> 
<p>Dropout</p>	<p>Scans without the selected color.</p> 
<p>Color Enhance</p>	<p>Enhances the selected color.</p>

Cleaning the Product

To keep your product operating at its best, follow the steps below to clean it periodically.

! **Important:**

- Never use alcohol, thinner, or corrosive solvent to clean the product. These chemicals can damage the product components and the case.
- Be careful not to spill liquid into the product mechanism or electronic components. This could permanently damage the mechanism and circuitry.
- Do not spray lubricants to the product.
- Never open the product case.

- 1** Turn off the product.
- 2** Unplug the AC adapter from the product.
- 3** Wipe off any dirt on the outer case with a soft cloth.

Note:

If the case is very dirty, dampen a soft cloth with water and wring it well, and then wipe off any remaining stains. After that, use a soft dry cloth to wipe the case.

Cleaning inside the scanner

When scanned images have streaks or when scanned documents become dirty, clean inside the scanner.

! **Important:**


- Do not place too much force on the glass surface inside the product.
- Be careful not to scratch or damage the glass surface inside the product, and do not use a hard or abrasive brush to clean it. A damaged glass surface can decrease the scan quality.
- Never use alcohol, thinner, or corrosive solvent to clean the scanner. These chemicals can damage the scanner components and the case.
- Be careful not to spill liquid into the scanner mechanism or electronic components. This could permanently damage the mechanism and circuitry.
- Do not spray lubricants inside the scanner.

Problems When Starting a Scan

- Check the status light and make sure the product is ready to scan.
- Make sure your cables are securely connected to the product and a working electrical outlet.
- Check that the electrical outlet is working. Plug another device into the electrical outlet and check that you can turn the power on.
- Turn off the product and computer, and then check the interface cable connection between them to make sure it is secure.
- Make sure you select the correct product if a scanner list is displayed when starting to scan.
- Connect the product directly to the computer's external USB port or through one USB hub only. The product may not work properly when connected to the computer through more than one USB hub. If the problem persists, try connecting the product directly to the computer.
- If more than one product is connected to your computer it may not work. Connect only the product you want to use, and then try scanning again.
- If the scanning software does not work properly, uninstall the software first and then reinstall it as described in the paper manual.
