

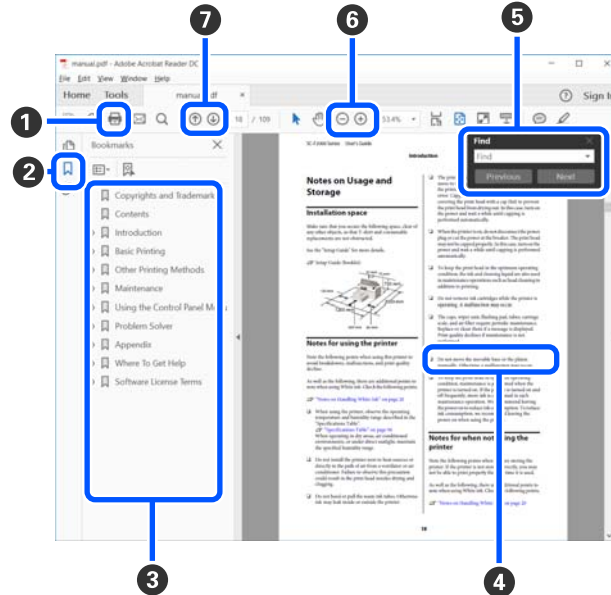

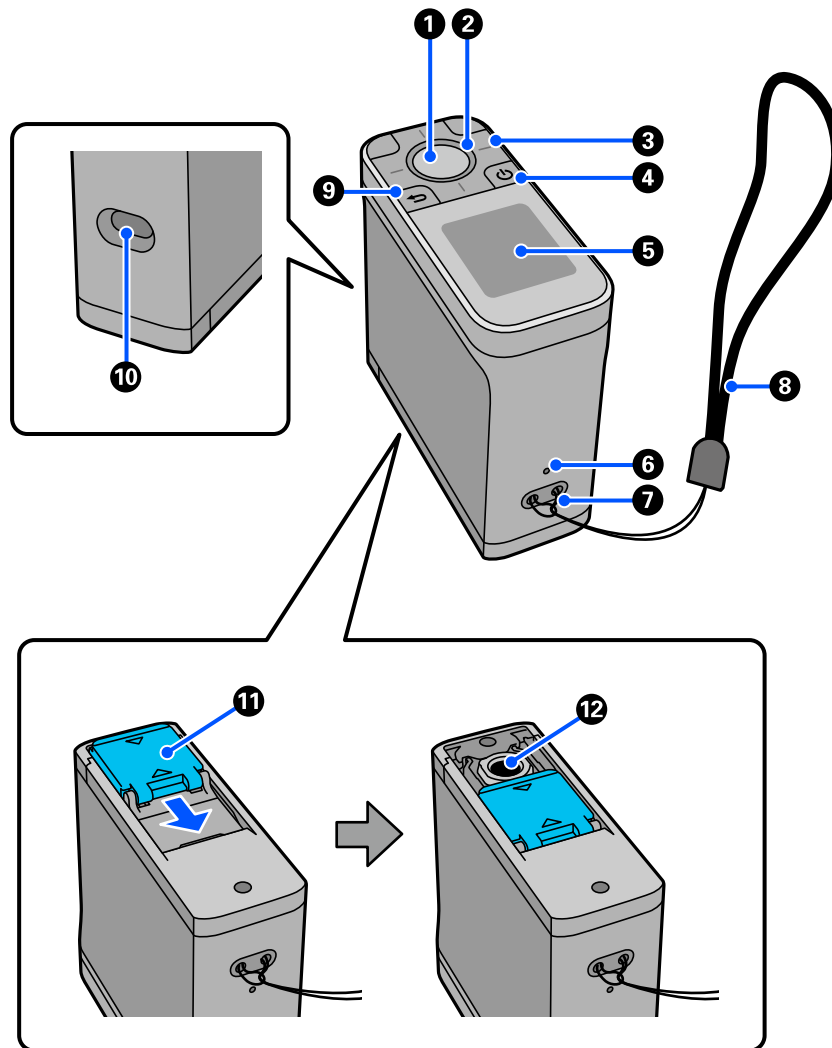

③	Navigation button	Press these buttons to switch the screen display or select an item. The functions of the navigation buttons depend on the rotation of the screen.
④	Power button	Turns the power on and off.

5	Screen	Displays color measurement results, menu items, error messages, and instructions.
6	Reset button	Turns off the spectrophotometer and resets it. Press this button if the device stops operating normally.
7	Strap hole	Attach the strap here to prevent the device from falling.
8	Strap	A strap to prevent the device from falling.
9	Back button	Displays the menu screen or returns you to the previous screen.
10	USB port	Connect the supplied USB cable to this port to supply power or charge the device, send color measurement results to a computer application, or update the firmware.
11	Sensor cover	Open this before starting color measurement. The inside of the sensor cover is inlaid with a white tile for calibration. Keep this closed when it is not in use to protect the sensor. 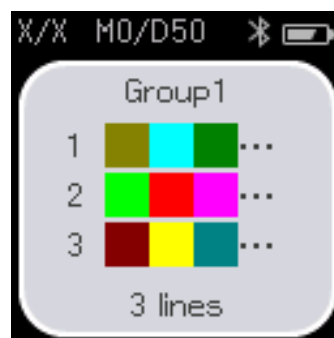

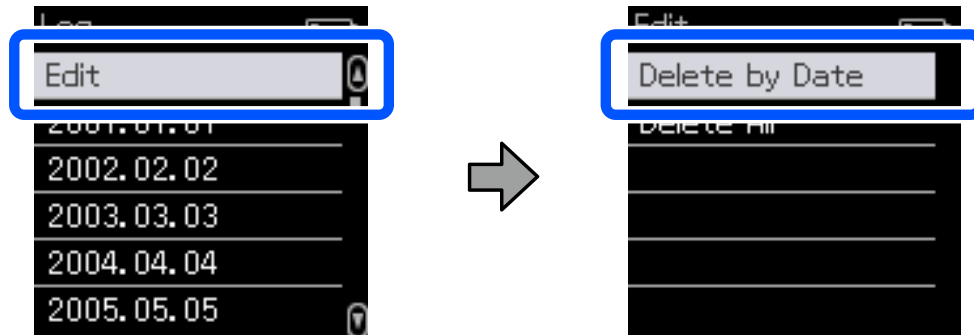
On the history screen, you can delete color measurement data or comparison results for this device, or register the data you want to keep to your favorites.

After registering the data that you want to keep to your favorites, you can delete data that has not been registered by selecting **Edit - Delete by Date** or **Delete All** in Spot mode, or **Edit - Delete the Data** or **Delete All** in Comparison (Spot) mode or Comparison (Scan) mode on the history screen.

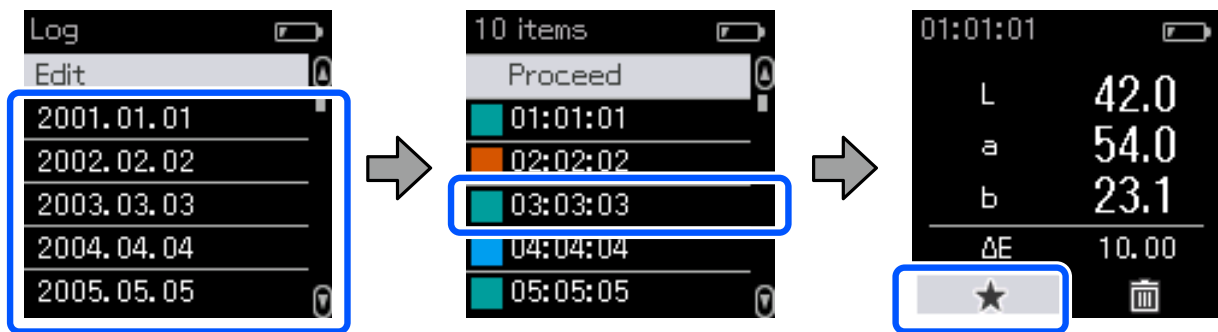

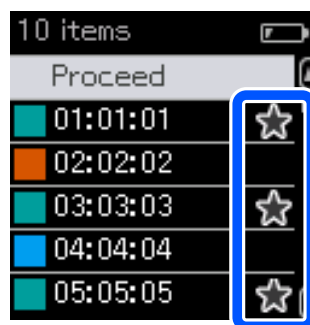
Select **Edit** on the history screen, select **Delete by Date** if you want to delete an individual data group, select the data group you want to delete, and delete it. Select **Delete All** to delete all data groups.



To identify the color measurement data you want to keep, select a data group from the history screen, select the data from the list of color measurement data in that group, and then select ☆ on the detailed data screen. You can also select 🗑️ to delete it.



Return to the color measurement data list screen, make sure that ☆ is displayed for the data you want to keep, select **Proceed**, and then press the enter button.

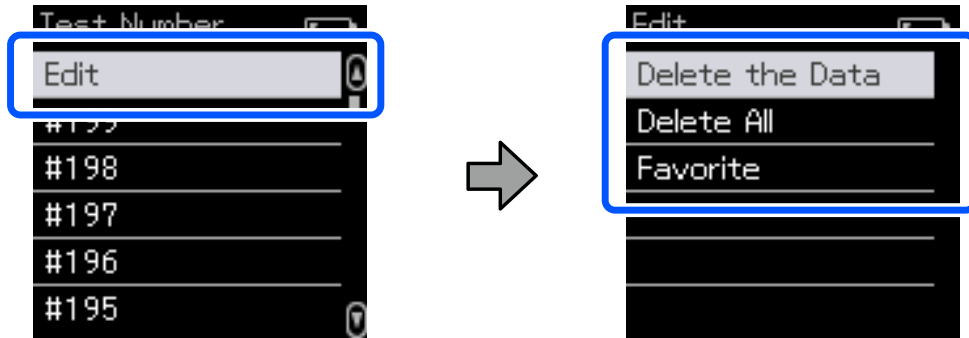


You can delete data that has not been registered to your favorites by returning to the history screen and selecting **Edit - Delete by Date** or **Delete All**.

To register data comparison results to your favorites, select **Favorite**, select the comparison results group you want to register, and then press the enter button.

If you want to delete all of the data comparison results that have not been registered to your favorites in one go, select **Delete All**, and then press the enter button.

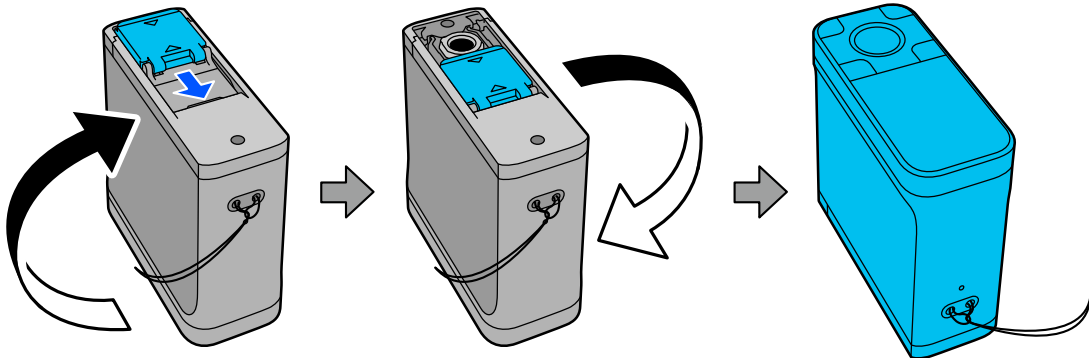

Measures the target color and displays its L*a*b* values. It also displays the color difference (ΔE^*) from the last color measurement, so you can compare two colors.

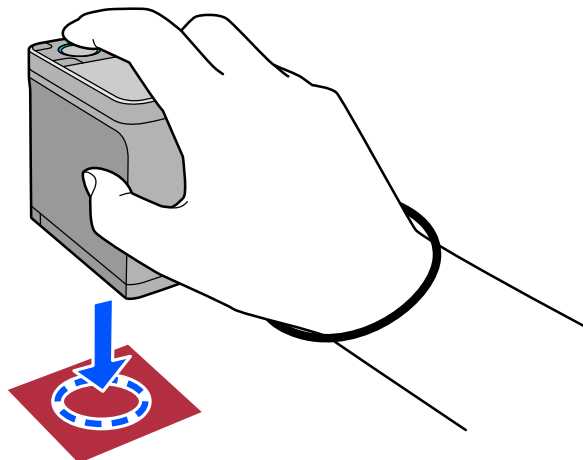
- 1 Turn on the device.
- 2 Follow the on-screen instructions when the calibration instructions are displayed. When calibration is complete, the color measurement screen is displayed.



- 3 Open the sensor cover on the base.



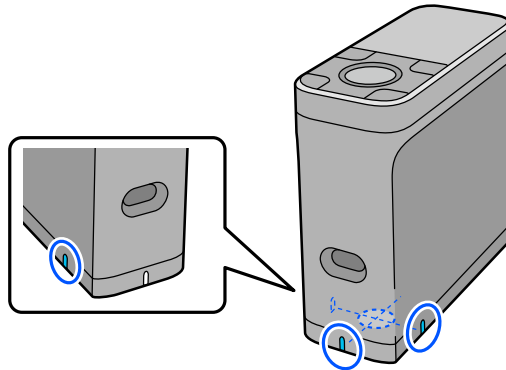

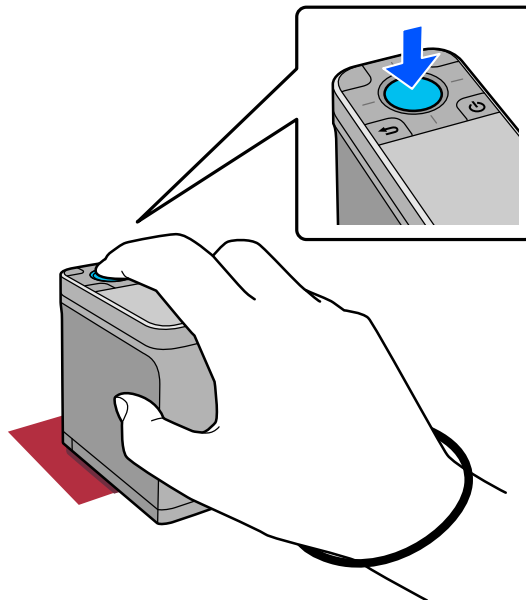

- 7** When color measurement is complete, close the sensor cover and turn off the device.

In this mode, you can automatically save up to 100 instances of color measurement data to the device. When this reaches 100 items, you need to choose whether to automatically delete the oldest data first, or manually delete unnecessary data from the history data.

*When the following screen is displayed, select **Auto** or **Manual**.*



- ❑ **When you select *Auto***
Whenever the number of color measurement data entries exceeds 100, the oldest data is automatically deleted. When you select **Auto**, **Auto Delete Data** is set to **On** in the Settings menu, and automatic data deletion is enabled until you change the setting.
- ❑ **When you select *Manual***
The history screen is displayed. Add the data you want to save to your favorites, select **Edit**, and then select **Delete by Date** or **Delete All** to delete the data by group or to delete all of the data groups. Comparison (Spot) Mode

Allows you to compare the colors for two groups in order. You can register the group of colors (reference data) you want to compare to the device in advance, and then select them before starting color measurement. You can determine whether the color difference between corresponding colors between groups and the average value are below or beyond the acceptable range that has been set.

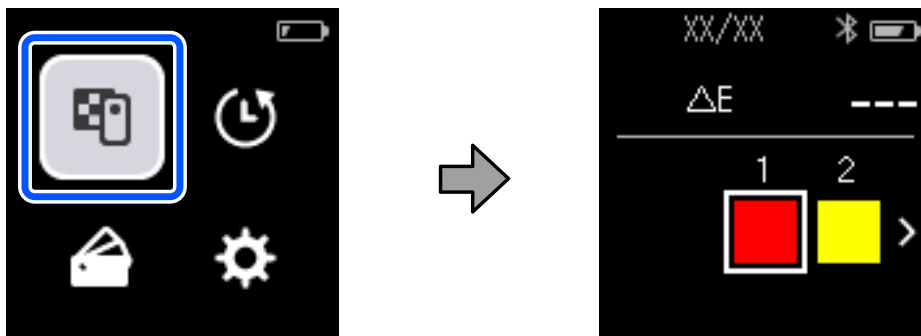
Note:

The number of data groups that you can register and the number of colors in each data group are the same as for Comparison (Scan) mode; up to 3 groups and 80 colors in each group.

- 1 Register the group for the comparison source color (reference data) and the value for the Passing Value to the device from the Epson Spectrometer smartphone app or an app that is compatible with the device.

- 2 Prepare a series of color measurement items you want to compare.
- 3 Turn on the device.
- 4 Follow the on-screen instructions when the calibration instructions are displayed.

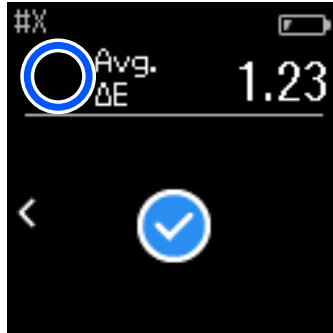
1	Displays when the compared color measurement value is less than or equal to the Passing Value. Displays when it is greater than the Passing Value.
2	The color being measured is displayed around the edges.
3	The color inside the square changes to the color to be measured and compared next.

If the color measurement result is or , the source data automatically moves to the next color in the sequence. Place the device on the next item to be measured, and then press the enter button. If you want to measure a color again, use the navigation button to move the focus to the previous reference color, and then measure the color again.

11 When color measurement is complete, press the enter button to check the results.

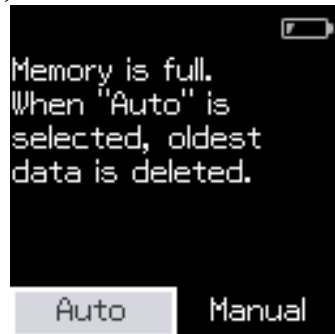
If the average color difference for corresponding colors between the groups is greater than the Passing Value,  is displayed next to the average color difference at the top of the screen. If the color difference is less than the Passing Value, it is not displayed.



12 Close the sensor cover and turn off the device.

Note:

- ❑ You can check the color measurement values of individual colors from the history screen by returning to the menu screen.
- ❑ In this mode, you can automatically save up to 500 instances of color measurement data to the device, including data measured in Comparison (Scan) mode. When this reaches 500 items, you need to choose whether to automatically delete the oldest data first, or manually delete unnecessary data from the history data. When the following screen is displayed, select **Auto** or **Manual**.



- ❑ When you select **Auto**
Whenever the number of color measurement data entries exceeds 500 (500 colors), the oldest data is automatically deleted.
When you select **Auto**, **Auto Delete Data** is set to **On** in the Settings menu, and automatic data deletion is enabled until you change the setting.
- ❑ When you select **Manual**

Comparison (Scan) Mode

You only need to perform a single color measurement operation to compare the colors for two groups of items. You can register the group of colors you want to compare to the device in advance, and then select them before starting color measurement. You can determine whether the color difference between corresponding colors between groups and the average value are below or beyond the acceptable range that has been set.
